Approval of 2023 AGM Meeting Minutes: Motion to approve the last meeting minutes, Scott first, Sandy Price second, all in favour, none opposed. Approved. **Presidents Report: Connie Down-Cicoria**

- Everything has been running fairly smoothly this year.
- A couple issues with NCHA; with Stampede, some contestants were told they could show, but then were told they couldn't. Connie and Julie Clarke worked on a proposal for a new class of show, with the accommodation of an aged event and weekend show. Les Jack has brought it to the EC. Waiting to hear back on a decision or next steps.
- Kim Krebs at ACHA received a letter from the NCHA; effective 2025, we will no longer be able to pay the 8% in CDN. They want it in USD now.
 Would like to know if other affiliates get the same letter. Connie is in discussions with the NCHA disputing the change.
- Financially we are in good shape. Have not received the NCHA subsidy yet, cheque must have been lost in the mail.
- Judges were not paid from Stampede Futurity (other than Rubin Pringle). It
 is possible that the paperwork was not filled out and/or submitted
 correctly. There is a concern that judges will not want to come up in the
 future. Connie has suggested that the CCHA pay the judges, and the
 Stampede pay CCHA. There were also a couple futurity winners that
 hadn't been paid until a week ago.

Financial Report: Connie Down-Cicoria - went over PNL and Balance Sheet. Motion to approve the financials as read, Darcy first, Dennis second, all in favour, none opposed. Approved.

Committee Reports:

Non-Pro: Sandy Reid – nothing to report Hall of Fame: Connie Down-Cicoria –

 Put 2 members into the hall of fame this year and have a 2025 nomination. Rules & Judges: Cody Smith-

- First year with new card, hopefully doesn't change again soon.
- Another judging clinic, possibly 2, in AB in 2025. There was a judging clinic in BC in November.

Finals Show Committee: Scott Brady-

- Year 4 for the CCHA/Aurora Finals show. 3rd year at the Stampede.
- Entries were 102 per day in 2021, 86 in 2022, 97 in 2023, 106 in 2024.
- Seeing an increase in the last 3 years.
- Seeing more SCHA and BCCHA members coming out.
- Show ran the same as last year, a few changes in the awards.
- Dance on Saturday night was well received.
- Haven't had the recap with the CS show committee yet.
- Went over the Award and Show Finances.

Sponsorship/Fundraising: Darcy Geherman

- Asked to raise 70K, raised just over that.
- Looking good for our Stallion Auction, plan to run it Feb 1-15. Have 17 stallion donors currently and also some cash donations.

Historical Committee: Matt Anderson

- An idea would be to do video interviews with some CCHA senior trainers and historical members; will get quotes on the pricing. Ask stampede if we can display the videos on the jumbotron during the cattle settles at the finals.
- We hired Lynn Graham from BC and had the rest of the historical data scanned and digitized.

National Communications: Amanda Smith/Les Jack –

- Les Jack is now our region 1 rep on the EC, first Canadian ever!
- NCHA wanted us to collect in CDN \$, but pay the 8% in USD. This is has now been dealt with.
- Canada was very well represented in the world finals.
- Some positives that the NCHA is doing: Western Bloodstock set a record of 40 million in sales; which means that other events will have larger payouts.
- Circuit finals should be well attended, we expect Canada to be well represented.
- Will rogers is supposed to get a major reno, which means Superstakes may be in a different arena.
- 40% (hauling)rule for the world standings may be enforced. EC will be having more meetings on the topic.

Disciplinary Committee: Connie Down-Cicoria

• One phone call – nothing came of it.

Annual Awards/Banquet: Lynn Edge/Micaela Thorlakson –

- We added a reserve buckle.
- 3rd place was a saddle rack.
- Had close to 100 people attend the banquet, only compliant: cash bar was a little expensive.

- b. Jill Rennie and Peppys Cashin Checks were 5th and the Weekend Winner with earning of just over\$3,290 at the finals and final total for the year \$14,179
- c. Ayden Gagno -- SIgn and Chromium ended his year in 15th spot.w total of \$6.776

- a. Leah Stewart and Footprints By Gypsy ended their year in 9th earning \$8163 for the year.
- b. Tory Correale and Lil Smooth Lu ended up 13th with total of \$7.089 and reserve Weekend Championships with \$3,23. for the show.
