Each recipient received a numbered Hall of Fame Certificate, and the recognition plaque with picture and write-up, hung in the CCHA Hall of Fame Display, located in the Calgary Stampede Agriculture Building.

The Hall of Fame Committee presents the following criteria to better inform the membership on the method employed to select candidates and appointees to the Canadian Cutting Horse Hall of Fame.

**CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO THE CANADIAN CUTTING HORSE ASSOCIATION HALL OF FAME**

The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to honor those of our members who have, through their dedication and untiring effort over a period of many years, made an outstanding contribution to this Association and the sport of cutting in Canada.

Membership in the Hall of Fame is the highest award this Association can bestow. In order for this award to maintain the prestige that is intended, only persons that have made an outstanding contribution over a long period, may be considered for inclusion. The following points should be taken into consideration.

1. New members will be inducted infrequently and always at the Association’s Annual Dinner.  
IN NO CASE WILL more than two be inducted in any one year.  
NOTE: At the 1987 Award Dinner, seven members were inducted, but these covered a span of over 30 years, an average of one each, for four and one half years.
2. Arena performance as such will not be considered.
3. A dedicated long-term contribution will normally outweigh a shorter more spectacular one.
4. All members considered should be of highest character.
5. While it is not desirable to deny membership to a deserving person, it is better to err on the conservative side. One undeserving member will decrease the prestige of all other members.
6. This award should be kept absolutely clear of politics, pressure and personal likes and dislikes.

Nominations to the Hall of Fame should include specific information as set out below:

1. Quality of Achievement (excluding arena performance).
2. Consistency of Achievement over extended period of time.
3. Significance of Achievement (specifics if applicable).
4. Character Assessment (clear record in community).
5. Summary - a full biography of the nominee candidate.
